

April is designated as Maternal Child Health Month (a Rotary area of focus).

Our members improve access to essential medical services for mothers and their children. These efforts are aimed at reducing the number of children under age five who die each year because of malnutrition, inadequate health care, and poor sanitation – a figure that is currently estimated at 7 million.

What can Rotary do? Rotary provides immunizations and antibiotics for measles, malaria, pneumonia, AIDS, and diarrheal diseases that are the leading causes of death in children under five. Promote good nutrition, including encouraging breastfeeding. Children who are fed breast milk are stronger and less vulnerable to disease than those who are not.

Prevent mother to-infant HIV transmission by encouraging the use of antiretroviral drugs and formula feeding.

So as we gather to celebrate Spring or Easter, whatever your tradition, give some thought to your loved ones, but also remember those less fortunate around the world.

Satellite Club Frequently Asked Questions

What is a Satellite Club? Satellite Clubs provide a new option for creating Rotary Clubs. A satellite club functions as a short term, transitional step on the way to becoming a full, independent Rotary Club. However, there is no time limit on the life of a satellite club.

Are Satellite Club members Rotarians? Yes, they are members of the sponsor club. They pay the same International Rotary dues as the sponsor club's members. Otherwise, the satellite club determines its own dues structure in collaboration with its sponsor club.

Can Satellite Clubs create a separate board with a different set of officers from the sponsor club? Satellite clubs set up their own board and have their own officers. However, instead of a President, a satellite club has a chair. It determines its own bylaws in collaboration with the Sponsor Club. The satellite club shall have a separate meeting place and time and may meet jointly from time to time with the
