Our club has several committees established to help divide up the work of the club. Here are some goals for those committees in the upcoming year. I am hoping to have the committee membership finalized in the next few weeks so if you haven't signed up already keep an eye out for an email from me.

- 1) **Membership:** Gain +1 net new member per month, which will bring us to a total membership of 117 as of June 30, 2016. In order to achieve this goal we not only need to invite our colleagues to meetings but also make Rotary in Brookings appealing and relevant.
- 2) **Foundation:** Increase giving to the Rotary Foundation. The money we give to the Foundation can come back to us both at the local and international level in the form of matching grants. The Rotary Foundation encourages giving \$100 per member each year to help Rotary accomplish its goals. This means we all should pledge at least \$8.34 per month for the good works of Rotary.
- 3) **Service:** This is where the rubber meets the road and where we can make a difference locally. Our club has several activities it participates in every year. I would like to see our club involved in a community service project at least once per quarter. These projects are also a good way to invite a friend to check out Rotary or get your family involved.
- 4) **Public Relations:** It is great that we are able to recognize the great students in Brookings, but I would like to enrich the "Student of the Month" program not only for the students but also for our members. While at Rotary International Convention I learned about a Rotary Mentorship program. Stay tuned for more details.

As Rotarians we should always be asking ourselves, how can we "Be a Gift to the World?"
