"MyRotary.org" is our website that can give almost any and all the information you might want or need to keep you abreast of what is happening in Rotary. In addition, our local club, District 5610 and Rotary International all have websites and Facebook pages to give you additional happenings within Rotary. For this month I am going to focus on "MyRotary.org" and some of the specific things that are available there.

As you open the pages of the MyRotary site, you will see links to Rotary.org (Rotary International's site) along with a "club finder" and "Join" and "Donate" links. It allows you to build or modify your "Profile" and other personal settings for your site.

As you get deeper into the MyRotary site, you will find areas that will allow you to "Exchange Ideas" with other Rotarians around the globe, join like-minded groups and explore events from something in Brookings to the International Convention in Hamburg, Germany. There are ways to find clubs and Rotarians that you may want to connect or reacquaint yourself with.

The next area allows you to "Take Action" with everything from developing a project, to giving to a cause, to applying for District and Global grants. You can also explore the options to "empower Leaders" in this section which includes everything from sponsoring a Rotaract or Interact club, organizing a RYLA event, or creating an 'exchange", scholarship or Rotary Fellowship and more.
