PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE FOR JANUARY

Welcome to the New Year Rotarians!

The New Year is a time to evaluate the past year and make a plan to better ourselves during the upcoming year. At our last meeting in December, we split up into small groups and made a few New Year's Resolutions for our Rotary Club. For those of you who were not able to make the last meeting I wanted to share them with you along with a few comments on how I think we can be successful in completing these goals.
