There is no need for guests to arrive early, random numbers for order of entry are drawn on the day of distribution at 3:50 pm.

This year we have provided financial grants for:

- Fine arts concert tickets to participants and their mentors in the Brookings County Youth Mentoring program
- Meals of Hope through the Brookings High School FFA (Meals of Hope is an international Rotary project)
- Rotary Garden rejuvenation at McCrory Garden (this is part of an ongoing request for matching district funding)
- Funding trees for the Delta Chi Boulevard Project (this was Rotary's 'Year of the Tree' and Rotarians were asked to plant a tree for each member).
- Funding for the 'Bee' Great Garden and Food Forest which Rotarian Robin Buterbaugh is starting
- Equipment for the camera club and gym at the Boys & Girls Club (this is part of an ongoing request for matching district funding

Our international project is the funding of a student at St Judes School in Arusha, Tanzania. Gregg and Vi Jongeling visited the school with a delegation of Rotarians from District 5610 in spring 2017. The school has been built and is supported by Rotary Clubs from around the world.

Local service work projects include volunteering for: Feeding Brookings, Bookings Back Pac (winning the trivia contest and donations), Share the Warmth (100 Coats from 100 Members), helping to complete the Boys & Girls Club renovated Discovery Room, October Fest to support Polio Plus, wrapping gifts for BCYMP, food and staff for 1 month's Harvest Table, staffing venue for 1 day of the Willie Mac Basketball Tournament, painting the East Central Behavioral Health building, packing meals for Meals of Hope, staffing help for the Brookings Marathon, and a work project at the Rotary Garden in McCrory Gardens.

Our ongoing projects include: Food for the Women's Abuse Shelter, the 4-Way Test Contest, recognizing the top 16 academic students from BHS, 5 Scholarships of \$1,000 each to local incoming SDSU freshmen, donations to the food pantry, donations to Harvest Table and the international youth exchange.

The public image campaign for Rotary International is 'People of Action'. This seems very appropriate for describing our club. I am so honored to be a part of Brookings Rotary. You are an extraordinary group of people.

Thank you so very much for your part in 'Making a Difference'. It has been a special year for me.
